# HOW TO REGISTER FOR SUMMER COURSES

## ATTENTION, CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS:

- Summer semester registration dates and procedures are different from those for the fall and spring semesters.
- A separate application for financial aid — the JSC Summer 2011 Financial Aid Application & Payment Form on page 15 — is required in addition to the usual FAFSA application.

## DEGREE-SEEKING UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS:

Register **March 28-May 11** online, or in person, by mail, or by fax using the registration form in this bulletin.

## DEGREE-SEEKING GRADUATE STUDENTS:

Register **March 28-July 5** online, or in person, by mail or by fax using the registration form in this bulletin unless otherwise noted.

## NON-DEGREE-SEEKING UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS:

Register **April 1-May 11** in person, by mail, or by fax using the registration form in this bulletin; unless otherwise noted.

## NON-DEGREE-SEEKING GRADUATE STUDENTS:

Register **April 1-May 11** in person, by mail, or by fax using the registration form in this bulletin unless otherwise noted.

Completed registration forms may be dropped off at the Registrar's Office in Martinetti Hall; mailed to Registrar's Office, Johnson State College, 337 College Hill, Johnson, VT 05656; or faxed to 802-635-1409.

The registration, add/drop and withdrawal deadlines for summer courses can be found in the "Deadlines & Details" column in this bulletin or on the Web via the Portal (select Web Services, then "Search for Sections" and detail into the "Section Name and Title" column of each course). See the next page for information on activating your JSC account and accessing the Portal. Refer to the JSC website for instructions regarding the procedures for adding, dropping and withdrawing from summer courses.

## SUMMER HOUSING

**Some on-campus housing is available for students taking summer courses.** We encourage you to reserve summer housing by May 1 to ensure a space and roommate choice. Space will be allotted, where available, for requests that come in after May 1. Students using summer housing for academic purposes must be registered for and attending class(es) while present in the residence halls. Arrival for academic summer housing is the day before a course begins; departure is by noon the day after the course ends. Rates: Full summer, term, and/or weekly rates available. Please contact the Residence Life Office in Dewey Hall (Room 158) or call 635-1200 for housing rates, for a Summer Housing Contract, and for questions about summer housing policies, procedures and availability. Please note that ARAMARK food services is not open for some parts of the summer. Students living in the residence hall will have access to kitchen facilities to make their own meals if they wish. There also are local food establishments and restaurants in Johnson and nearby towns.

# IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW • IMPORTANT THINGS TO DO

**OFFICIAL JSC COMMUNICATIONS & OTHER FUNCTIONS ARE CONDUCTED PRIMARILY ONLINE.** JSC uses email to communicate official business to students. Upon registration, you will be provided a free JSC email account. **It is your responsibility to stay up to date with email sent to your JSC email account. If you choose to forward your JSC email to another email address, you remain responsible for the contents of any official message, including attachments, sent by the College.** In addition, you are expected to use VSC Web Services to access class schedules, unofficial transcripts and grade reports.

Within 48 hours of registering for a course, all students will have access to the Portal, JSC email and VSC Web Services. (See box.)

As mandated by federal law, students who are U.S. citizens must provide their Social Security Number when registering for the first time. (This requirement does not apply to students enrolled in contract courses paid for by an external entity.) Your SSN is closely guarded and kept in strict confidence by the Vermont State Colleges.

Many instructors use the online Portal system to post assignments and supplemental course materials. If you are taking online or hybrid courses, you may be required to regularly access the course through the Portal (Hybrid courses are courses that are conducted partly online and partly in class.)

## ACCESSING THE PORTAL, EMAIL & VSC WEB SERVICES

Before you can access the Portal, JSC email and VSC Web Services, you must activate your account. This should be done before the semester starts. If you experience difficulties accessing your account, submit a request for assistance to the Help Desk at <http://helpdesk.vsc.edu>.

### The Portal:

*If you have previously used the Portal:* Log on to your Portal account. Click on the “Change Password” under “Tools” at the left. Follow the online instructions to change your password. This process will activate your JSC network and email accounts and apply your new password to all of your accounts.

*If you are using the Portal for the first time:* Go to <http://blackboard.vsc.edu> (after May 15: <http://myjsc.jsc.edu>). Click on the blue login button, then the “Activate my account” tab at the top. You will need to provide your College ID number and the last 4 digits of your SSN. Follow the online instructions to set a password, which will activate all of your accounts. Your user name will be listed on the page after you activate your account.

### EMAIL:

To access your email account through the Portal, click on the email link at the left of the screen after logging into the Portal.

### VSC WEB SERVICES:

To access VSC Web Services, log on to <http://blackboard.vsc.edu> prior to May 15 (starting May 15 at <http://myjsc.jsc.edu>), select the VSC Web Services box at left, then select the “Students” tab.

**TOPICAL SEMINAR IN ANTHROPOLOGY: INTRODUCTION TO ETHNOMUSICOLOGY**

Ethnomusicology is “the study of people making music.” Through the study of the relationship of musical systems to social and cultural structures, researchers have provided insight into the myriad ways that music and culture act upon each other. Through readings, discussion, lecture, audio and video, we will investigate and experiment with some of the principal approaches scholars have taken to the study of music in culture. The major assignment for this course will be a research project dealing with musical practices in students’ local communities.

**TOPICAL SEMINAR IN ANTHROPOLOGY: UNEARTH THE PAST – FIELD ARCHAEOLOGY ON THE LAMOILLE**

Become a participant in the Lamoille Archaeology Project. Working with local farmers, residents, community groups, visitors, and the Vermont Division of Historic Preservation, our goal is to contribute to our understanding and knowledge of the Lamoille River’s cultural heritage. Variable credit options enable college-level students, community teachers, and archaeological enthusiasts to experience this hands-on investigation that provides employment opportunities, wage betterment, and self-enrichment. Learn how archaeologists transform artifacts into living cultures, and share our rich, local cultural heritage with others. Our excavations will focus primarily on a Native American Site at Boyden Farm, but will probe elsewhere along the Lamoille River from Fairfax to Johnson and possibly beyond.

**TOPICAL SEMINAR IN COUNSELING: CURRICULUM & CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT FOR COUNSELORS**

School counselors, SAP counselors and school-based mental health counselors have the opportunity to present information to students individually, in small groups and in classroom sessions. Counselors are asked to co-teach with a variety of faculty, and many school counselors and SAP counselors are required to develop and present curriculum. This course will provide counselors an opportunity to engage in curriculum design, instruction and assessment, and will provide the opportunity to research and practice classroom management strategies.

**SPECIAL TOPICS: REALISM IN FICTION AND FILM**

This course attempts to define realism by looking at works which offer different shadings of this difficult term: the novel of manners, the naturalistic novel, the Italian Neorealist Film, French Poetic Realism, and others. Students will be required to write a “documentary definition” of realism.

**TOPICAL SEMINAR: LIVING THE GOOD LIFE – SPIRITUAL HEALING AND WELLBEING**

This course will take you on an experiential journey into healing illness and creating a wellness lifestyle by learning practices that lead to greater presence, self-awareness, and connection to nature. You will explore a variety of mind-body techniques including meditation and yoga. You will experience the healing power of nature through ceremony, energy medicine and shamanic techniques. The goal of this course is for you to gain skills necessary to begin, refine, or deepen your own spiritual life, while developing insight into compassionate and skillful ways to contribute to a globally conscious and sustainable lifestyle of health and wellbeing. **TOPICAL SEMINAR: MULTI-CULTURAL ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY**

This course will explore the basic concepts and principles of diverse global approaches to the structure and function of the human body to maintain life, health and wellness. ### REGULATIONS FOR MEASLES IMMUNIZATION

Any doses given before 1968 must have been documented as having been “live” vaccines. One of the doses must have been after 1980. You must provide this documentation only the first time you register at Johnson State College.
