# HOW TO REGISTER FOR SUMMER COURSES

## DEGREE-SEEKING UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS:

Register online from April 1 – May 13. Undergraduate, campus-based course cancellations will be made based on enrollments as of May 14. Register on time so that your registration counts. Degree-seeking students may register for courses that have been approved to run, and add and drop courses, online up to the day before the course begins. After the course begins, all registrations and course adds/course drops must be done in person, by mail, or by fax using the Summer Registration Form in this bulletin or by submitting a Registration Adjustment Form (obtained at the Registrar's Office) respectively. Refer to the registration, add/drop, and withdrawal deadlines in this bulletin or in the VSC Web Services' Search for Sections.

## DEGREE-SEEKING GRADUATE STUDENTS:

Register online beginning April 1 and up to the advertised registration deadline for each graduate course noted in the "Deadlines & Details" column for each course in this bulletin and in the "Section Name and Title" column for each course in VSC Web Services' Search for Sections. Graduate course cancellations will be made based on enrollments as of the course's registration deadline date. Register on time so that your registration counts. Degree-seeking graduate students may register for courses that have been approved to run, and add and drop courses, online up to the day before the course begins. After the course begins, all registrations and course adds/course drops must be done in person, by mail, or by fax using the Summer Registration Form in this bulletin or a Registration Adjustment

Form (obtained at the Registrar's Office) respectively. Refer to the registration, add/drop, and withdrawal deadlines in this bulletin or in the VSC Web Services' Search for Sections.

## NON-DEGREE-SEEKING UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS:

Register April 5-May 13 in person, by mail, or by fax using the Summer Registration Form in this bulletin. Undergraduate, campus-based course cancellations will be made based on enrollments as of May 14. Register on time so that your registration counts. Course registrations and course adds/course drops must be done in person, by mail, or by fax using the Summer Registration Form or a Registration Adjustment Form (obtained via the Registrar's Office) respectively by the deadlines noted in the "Deadlines & Details" column of this bulletin or in the "Section Name and Title" column for each course in VSC Web Services' Search for Sections.

## NON-DEGREE-SEEKING GRADUATE STUDENTS:

Register in person, by mail, or by fax using the registration form in this bulletin beginning April 5 and up to the registration deadline noted in the "Deadlines & Details" column for each individual course in this bulletin or in the "Section Name and Title" column for each individual course in VSC Web Services' Search for Sections. Graduate course cancellations will be made based on enrollments as of the course's registration deadline date. Register on time so that your registration counts. Course registrations and course adds/course drops must also be done in person, by mail, or by fax using the Summer Registration Form or a Registration Adjustment Form (obtained at the Registrar's Office) by the deadlines noted.

Completed registration forms may be dropped off at the Registrar's Office in Martinetti Hall; mailed to Registrar's Office, Johnson State College, 337 College Hill, Johnson, VT 05656; or faxed to 802-635-1409.

## SUMMER HOUSING

Some on-campus housing is available for students taking summer courses. We encourage you to reserve summer housing by May 1 to ensure a space and roommate choice. Space will be allotted, where available, for requests that come in after May 1. Students using summer housing for academic purposes must be registered for and attending class(es) while present in the residence halls. Arrival for academic summer housing is the day before a course begins; departure is by noon the day after the course ends. Rates: Full summer, term, and/or weekly rates available. Please contact the Residence Life Office in Dewey Hall (Room 158) or call 635-1200 for housing rates, for a Summer Housing Contract, and for questions about summer housing policies, procedures and availability. Please note that JSC Dining Services (Sodexo) is not available during some parts of the summer. Students living in the residence hall will have access to kitchen facilities to make their own meals if they wish. There also are local food establishments and restaurants in Johnson and nearby towns.

# IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW • IMPORTANT THINGS TO DO

**OFFICIAL JSC COMMUNICATIONS & OTHER FUNCTIONS ARE CONDUCTED PRIMARILY ONLINE.** JSC uses email to communicate official business to students. Upon registration, you will be provided a free JSC email account. **It is your responsibility to stay up to date with email sent to your JSC email account. If you choose to forward your JSC email to another email address, you remain responsible for the contents of any official message, including attachments, sent by the College.** In addition, you are expected to use VSC Web Services to access class schedules, unofficial transcripts and grade reports.

Within 48 hours of registering for a course, all students will have access to the portal, JSC email and VSC Web Services. (See box.)

As mandated by federal law, students who are U.S. citizens must provide their Social Security Number when registering for the first time. (This requirement does not apply to students enrolled in contract courses paid for by an external entity.) Your SSN is closely guarded and kept in strict confidence by the Vermont State Colleges.

Many instructors use the online portal system to post assignments and supplemental course materials. If you are taking online or hybrid courses, you may be required to regularly access the course through the portal (Hybrid courses are courses that are conducted partly online and partly in class.)

## ACCESSING THE PORTAL, EMAIL & VSC WEB SERVICES

Before you can access the portal, JSC email and VSC Web Services, you must activate your account. This should be done before the semester starts. If you experience difficulties accessing your account, submit a request for assistance to the Help Desk at <http://helpdesk.vsc.edu>.

### The MyJSC Portal:

*If you have previously used the portal:* Log on to your portal account. Click on the “Change Password” under “Tools” at the left. Follow the online instructions to change your password. This process will activate your JSC network and email accounts and apply your new password to all of your accounts.

*If you are using the portal for the first time:* Go to [http:// MyJSC.jsc.edu](http://MyJSC.jsc.edu). Click on the blue login button, then the “Activate my account” tab at the top. You will need to provide your College ID number and the last 4 digits of your SSN. Follow the online instructions to set a password, which will activate all of your accounts. Your user name will be listed on the page after you activate your account.

### EMAIL:

To access your email account through the portal, click on the email link at the right of the screen after logging into the portal.

### VSC WEB SERVICES:

To access VSC Web Services, log on to the portal ([http:// MyJSC.jsc.edu](http://MyJSC.jsc.edu)), select the VSC Web Services box at the bottom left, then select the “Students” tab.

Students may register and add/drop EDP courses online through May 19. Starting May 20, all transactions must be submitted in person, by mail or by fax using the Summer Registration Form or a Registration Adjustment Form by the deadlines noted below.

**REGISTRATION** Consult with your advisor about registering. **Deadline: May 13, 2013.** Please register early to ensure your space in courses.

**DROP DEADLINE:** Friday, May 31, is the deadline to drop summer EDP courses, including online courses. All course drops after May 19 must be submitted on a Registration Adjustment Form.

**ADD DEADLINE:** Friday, May 31. All course adds after May 19 must be submitted on a Registration Adjustment Form.

**WITHDRAWAL DEADLINE:** Wednesday, July 10. All course withdrawals must be submitted on a Registration Adjustment Form.

**PAYMENT** Details are available at <http://MyJSC.jsc.edu>. Log in to the portal. Under Web Services, click into Student Billing/Financials to locate your bill. A \$100 late fee will be applied if your bill is not paid by the due date. Tuition, course fees and other charges are due by May 13 (including school district/third-party letters of guarantee or purchase orders) or you may be dropped from your courses on May 20. If applying for financial aid, JSC's Summer 2013 Financial Aid Application & Payment Form must be submitted to JSC's Business Office at the time of registration. A \$100 late fee will be assessed if one of these conditions is not met.

Click "Undergraduate Students Resources," and you will find "EDP Info and Syllabi" under "Frequently Requested Documents." Syllabi will not be mailed. It is your responsibility to get them from the Web site and to be prepared for the first class meeting.

**FIRST ASSIGNMENTS** Many EDP courses include a reading assignment or other task that must be completed before the first class meeting. It is your responsibility to get this information from the syllabus on the JSC Web site or portal.

**WEEKEND CLASS TIMES** All Saturday and Sunday courses meet from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. unless otherwise stated in the description. Regardless of the date of the first

meeting, weekend courses begin on the first day of the semester, May 20.

**ONLINE COURSES** To access your online courses, go to <http://MyJSC.jsc.edu> to My Moodle Classes. Courses may not appear until one week prior to the first class date.

**MANDATORY ATTENDANCE** Attendance is mandatory at all Saturday and Sunday classes. Please do not register for these courses if you know you cannot attend all classes.

We will delight in learning from the plants and each other as we identify, harvest, prepare, and properly use herbs as medicines.
